INDIA PROMOTION '88

The prestigious Danish department store, Magasin du Nord, held a three-week-long India Promotion '88 from May 2 to May 21 at its five branches in Denmark. The promotion, which was carried out in collaboration with the Trade Development Authority of India, Embassy of India, Copenhagen, Air India and the Government of India Tourist Office, displayed a large number of Indian goods, textiles, handicrafts, costume jewellery and paintings.

Ten craftsmen were specially flown into Copenhagen to give a practical demonstration of traditional handicrafts. A special exhibition of Madhubani paintings was put up by the Indian Council of Cultural Relations. Indian food, served at all the cafeterias, was prepared by cooks provided by the Centaur Hotel.

The idea of such an exhibition germinated when some executives of the Magasin du Nord visited a similar promotion in Zurich. Subsequently they contacted the Indian Ambasador and the Trade Development Authority of India. Twelve months of regular contacts and consultations resulted in this the first-ever promotion of Indian


