Japan's summers can already be brutal: between 2018 and 2022, 1,250 people on average have died each year of heatstroke; and the past two summers have been the hottest on record. Now scientists have warned that, within 40 years, intensive exercise is likely to be dangerous in three-quarters of Japan between 3pm and 6pm during the summer.



Tunis
Dissent crushed: Forty prominent opposition figures in Tunisia have been sentenced to prison terms of between 13 to 66 years, on charges of sedition and membership of a terrorist group. They include

of the main opposition coalition, as lawyers and journalists; most led in absentia, having fled country to escape President Saied's own on dissent. Saied was atically elected in 2019, but has dissolved parliament and staged a nging power grab. In an election oober, he won a second term with the vote on a turnout of 29%.

Pahalgam, India

Tourists murdered: At least 26 people were killed this week when gunmen opened fire on a group of mainly domestic tourists in Indian-administered Kashmir. The atrocity took place in a picturesque valley near the resort town of Pahalgam. A group calling itself The Resistance Front claimed responsibility for the attack – believed to have been the worst targeting civilians in years – citing discontent about tens of thousands of “outsiders” being settled in the mountainous, Muslim-majority region, which is divided between India and Pakistan, but claimed in full by both.
